## Indiana Chapter

### OFFICIALS NOMINATED

The regular quarterly meeting of the Indiana Chapter, APCO, was held in Anderson, Indiana, September 2, 1948. President Harry Evans called the meeting to order at 1:30 P.M.

Glenn Rogers, chairman of the Engineering Committee, was introduced and read the committee's report of specifications for radio equipment and stations. After covering the specifications part by part and making slight changes it was moved and passed that the Indiana Chapter adopt the report.

President Evans introduced the manufacturers' representatives present, and two guests from the Kentucky State Highway Patrol, Guy N. Ferrell and Austin J. Mattingly.

This being the meeting in which nominations are made, the President appointed a nominating committee composed of Robert Batts, Robert Gaskill, Al Titus, Roy O. Smith and Zellon Audritsh.

The minutes of the previous meeting and the Treasurer's report for the last quarter were read and approved.

The subject of there being no APCO Chapter in Kentucky was discussed, and on a motion which was seconded and passed, the Indiana Chapter will accept memberships from the State of Kentucky until such time that a Chapter is started there.

The Operation Procedure committee distributed two groups of additional sheets to be inserted in the Manuals.

Roy O. Smith, Chairman of the Public Relations committee, reported that his committee is assembling photos and stories of public interest, and would appreciate any photos or stories supporting APCO and police radio.

Zellon Audritsh and Robert Batts gave a brief description of the meeting held at Chicago at which time the RTPB, Panel 13, was disbanded and the RTCL organized.

The chapter was given assurance by action of the Indiana Chiefs of Police at a recent conference, when they went on record promising assistance to APCO in any way possible. The same assurance was given by the National Executive Board of the Fraternal Order of Police, at a recent meeting at Evansville.

After considerable discussion on the subject of changing the name of APCO, it was moved and passed that the Indiana Chapter go on record as opposing the changing of the name from APCO. It was also moved and passed that the Chapter go on record as opposing the admission of any but police communication officers, as active members of APCO. This shall not be construed as excluding anyone to associate membership.

The question of the National executive committee being appointed by the National President instead of being elected by the members at large was discussed. A motion was made, seconded and passed, instructing the Resolution committee to draw up a resolution that the National committee members should be elected by their respective local chapters, and not appointed by the National President.

A motion was also made that a resolution be sent to the National Conference suggesting that the selection of next year's Conference city be left to the Executive committee.

The Nomination committee reported the following nominations: President, N. Covert of Evansville and Otto Kirby of Noblesville; 1st Vice President, James Stoll of East Chicago and Paul Mishler of Kokomo; 2nd Vice President, G. V. Maynard of Hammond and Laure Wert of South Bend; Secretary-Treasurer, R. B. Jones of Fort Wayne and Robert Batts of Indianapolis. Directors, two to be elected: Al Titus of Anderson, Robert Gaskill of Fort Wayne, Jack Alexander of LaPorte and Jack Pritchard of ISP, Charleston.

On invitation of Zellon Audritsh the next meeting will be held at Stout Field, Indiana State Police, December 6th. The election will be held and annual reports received at this meeting.

The Resolutions committee was instructed to draw resolutions as required by the above mentioned motions, and one other resolution, that of changing the annual Conference to a bi-annual Conference and holding area meetings on the odd years. Unanimous approval was given all the resolutions.

It was voted to allow the President expense money to attend the National
