in the chapter he urged that each member become a committee of one to seek out new members. We are dedicated to the improvement of all phases of police communications, therefore we should seek members active in all the phases. For continued improvement and expansion the cooperation of all police agencies in the state is necessary. Emphasizing that we are not merely an organization of technical personnel, he recommended steps be taken to acquaint the administrative personnel of the various departments with the purposes of our organization. Every police department in the state of Indiana, whether using radio directly or not, has benefited from past activities of APCO.

Mr. Thalls reported on the retirement of Walter Weigner of PD Elkhart and Roy Smith of PD Muncie, stating that they were eligible for honorary membership in the Chapter. Such membership was approved.

Zellon Audritsh reported on activities of the Frequency Allocation Committee. More than 30 new departments received recommendations from the committee during 1955. He also summarized activities of the committee with regard to the toll road request for frequency recommendations.

Frank Campbell, Chairman of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, reported on activity of that group in drawing up the new constitution and distributed copies to the members. (Copies are still available by writing to the Secretary-Treasurer.)

By unanimous vote the following officers were elected for 1956: President, Dane Ridenour; First Vice-President, Frank Farkas; Second Vice-President, Billie Abraham; Secretary - Treasurer Wayne Thalls; Directors, Frank Campbell and Clifton Small.

The meeting was turned over to newly elected President Ridenour, who thanked the group for choosing him and stated that he would take action toward increasing membership as recommended by Gaskill. He further stated that he was desirous of continuing work on compiling some type of operations manual for general distribution.

President Ridenour stated that the only standing committee was the Frequency Allocations Committee and that its membership would remain the same with one exception. Frank Campbell will replace retiring member Roy Smith. Zellon Audritsh continues as Chairman, assisted by Robert Gaskill, Clifton Small, N. D. Covert and Harry Evans.
