for the year include:

1. A very successful fall meeting
with some 200 registrations.

purposes of continuity in
planning and reporting.
3. Made automatic the designa-
tion of the chapter secretary-
treasurer as the delegate to

attendance at the conference.
4. Membership dues were raised
in order to provide needed
funds.
