While a Report and Order resolving most of the wireless issues was adopted this past July, the PBX and other wired telephone issues remained unresolved, in part due to opposition from representatives of large PBX owners and some telephone equipment vendors.

On September 19 and 20, the FCC's Common Carrier Bureau attempted to push the proceeding forward by holding a two-day public meeting among public safety representatives, PBX owners, equipment vendors and Bell operating companies.
