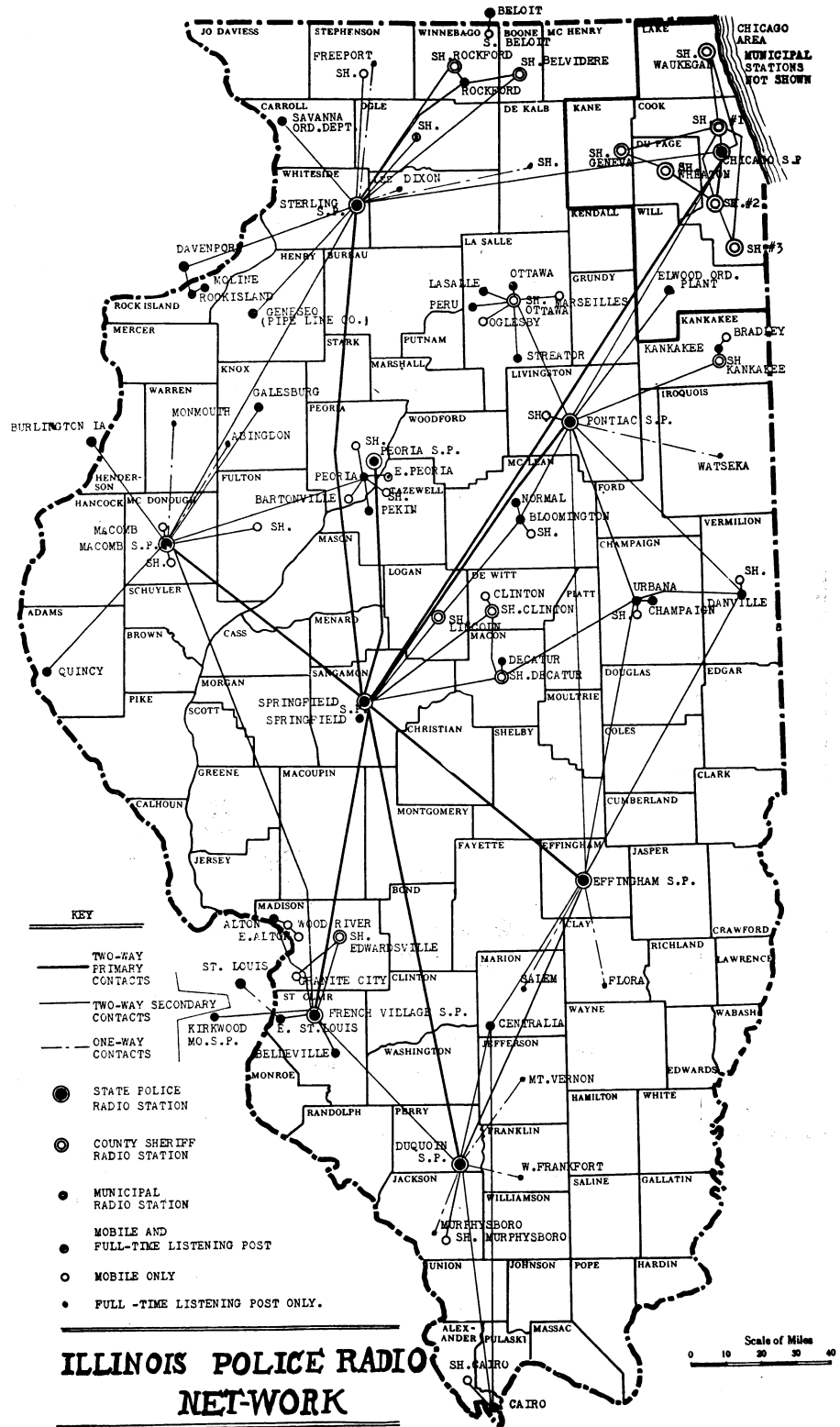

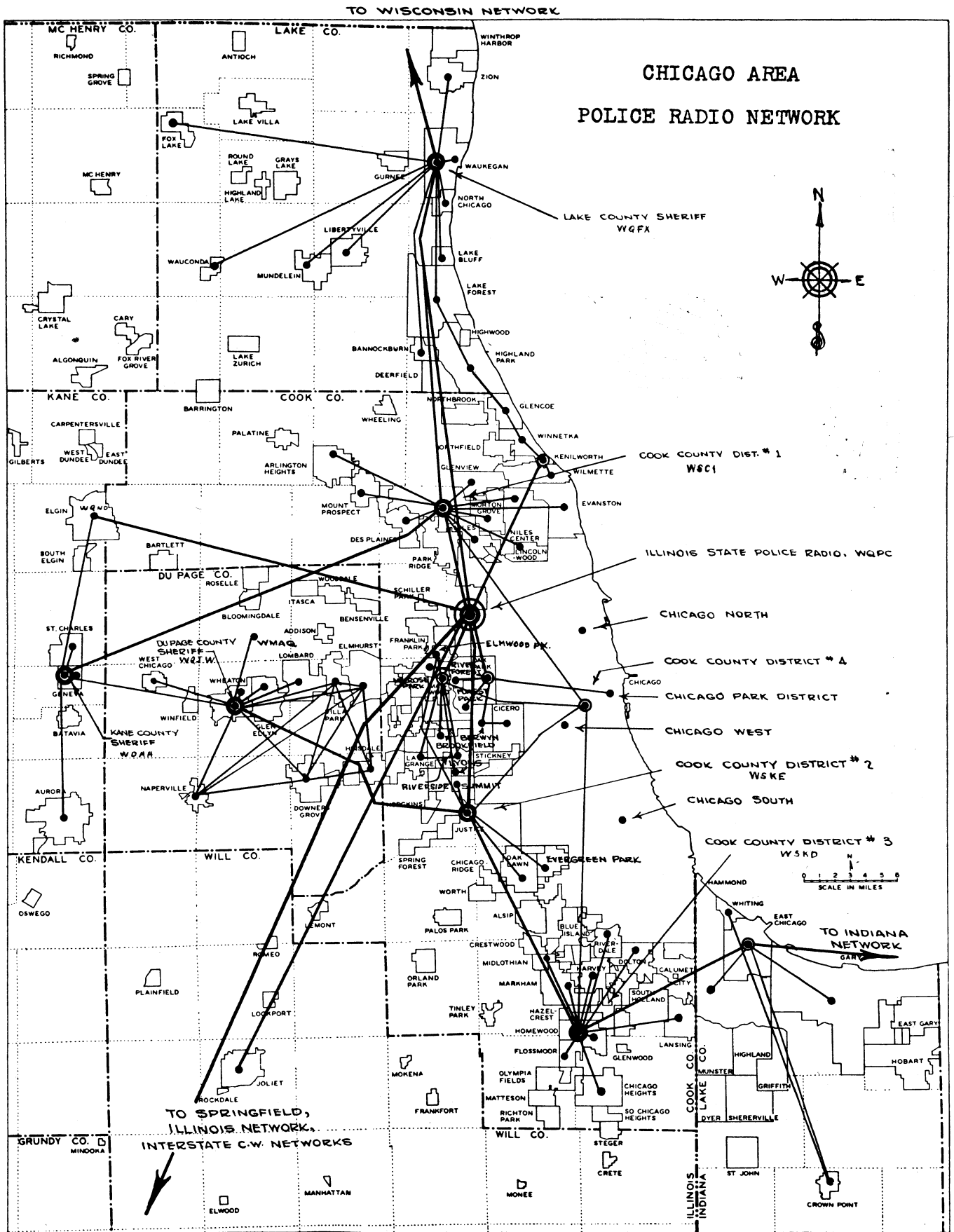

Your letter of June 15th, recieved this A.M. along with a load of other mail I found waiting on my return from a few days out of the city, so will answer yours without any further delay.


I trust you have seen fit to procede without my approval with your program of having a page size, Illinois Contact Map, printed up for the National Directory, as it meets with sentiments 100%.
