Gentlemen:

Herewith you will find a statement of income and expense for the APCO BULLETIN from its transfer to Detroit in October, 1945 through June, 1947. Also you will find the monthly reports for April, May and June of 1947.

I regret very much my inability to attend the National Conference at Los Angeles where I could talk to you personally about our publication as I am deeply concerned about the Bulletin and its future welfare. Due to my absence may I take this means of briefly stating the situation.

As you well know, the Bulletin is an extremely valuable part of our organization and it must be maintained on a high level. We must not overlook the fact that it is the tie among our membership and, even more important, it is giving a service to our country and beyond that is not covered by any other medium. Moreover, the Bulletin has been and shall continue to be a publication that fosters improvement and cooperation between communication divisions and the law enforcement groups they serve.

During the period of the Bulletin's publication in Detroit it has fallen short on two counts: the financial structure, or advertising, and the matter of technical articles. Had the Bulletin carried a good technical article each and every month and had just an additional page and one half of advertising, I personally would not feel bad about my services as editor. Inasmuch as I have failed to increase the advertising sufficiently to make it financially sound and to extract technical material, even at the cost of neglecting my family, I respectfully request that my name be held from nomination for editor at the Los Angeles Conference.

There are men within our organization who are well qualified and are in a position to overcome the problems which I have had to face. A person who has sufficient time to devote to correspondence could, I am sure, overcome both of the above

difficulties. Then, too, it might be well to place the Bulletin in a small town where printing costs would be at a minimum rather than at the high rates we are forced to accept. With either or both of these moves there should be no reason why the high level of the Bulletin cannot be maintained.

May I take this opportunity to thank the many members who have assisted me during my term of office. There has been a very great personal satisfaction and enjoyment from the contacts and acquaintances made in the course of the work. It is with regret that I find it necessary, for the good of the organization as well as for the good of my family, that I request the acceptance of my resignation.
