Dear Ed:

Although we are right in the middle of the Bulletin at present, I want to take time out to comment on the several letters received from you and which to date I have not had time to answer. In your letter to Chatterton dated April 16, I note that you plan on going to New York City sometime in May. I hope you will have time to get things ironed out for the Convention. Among the several things we would like to know are:

- (1) Has it been definitely settled that the teletype conference will be held at the same time as ours? If so, will it be in the same hotel? Do they rent booths and display merchandise? Will it be necessary for us to divide receipts with them?
- (2) What hotel, what are the rates, how big is the assembly room, how many booths and what will booth sizes be, how much will we charge, what are the dates?
- (3) What will the registration fee be, will the ladies be provided for, will separate registration for the ladies be required?
- (4) Do I contact the St. Louis Button Company regarding the badges or will they be selected in New York City?
- (5) Who will write the contracts for booth sales? Floor plans and contracts should be forwarded to the interested manufacturers as soon as possible, and please include the Philco Company, the Galvin Manufacturing Company and the Arvin Company in any letters forwarded to manufacturers regarding the sale of convention booths.
