tional stations of the same or less power or upon proper showing being made, may authorize such additional power as may be necessary but not to exceed 500 watts, provided, however, that municipal police stations authorized to serve an entire county under the provisions of Rule 331, may be licensed to employ a maximum daytime\* power of 1000 watts.

\*Daytime means from local sunrise to local sunset."

Much discussion was had on the subject and Mr. Franklin of Texas, pointed out the difficulties which they were experiencing in Texas. After much discussion a motion was made by Mr. Franklin and seconded by Lt. Waitt that a committee be appointed to investigate the situations as far as possible and report back before the termination of the convention. Motion carried.

PRESIDENT BATTS:- I wish to suggest, that in as much as the discussion is on two separate cases, by that I mean on Lt. Cox' case and Mr. Franklin's of Texas, that I will appoint a special committee made up of the Technical Committee which is composed of Herbert F. Waring, Milwaukee, Wis; Lawrence N. Geno, Buffalo, N.Y., and E.J. Scroggin, Kansas City, Mo., and the Resolutions Committee which is composed of L.L. Waitt, Boston, Mass; William A. Nelson, Niagara Falls, New York, and Louis R. Padberg, Jr., of St. Louis, Mo., and also request that Lieutenants Cox of Berkely, California and Mr. Franklin of Houston, Texas, be present at the meeting. Mr. Waitt, I will make you Chairman of the entire committee and I request that your committee be ready to report back here by 4:00 o'clock this afternoon.

Meeting was then adjourned for lunch.
