

cations Commission the revision of Rule 330-A to read in continuance as follows: In the event that the amount of power allocated above is insufficient to afford reliable coverage over the desired service area, the Commission may authorize the use of additional stations of the same or less power or upon proper showing being made, may authorize such additional power as may be necessary but not to exceed 500 watts, provided, however, that Municipal Police Stations authorized to serve an entire county under the provisions of Rule 331, may be licensed to employ a maximum daytime* power of 1000 watts, on condition that the applicant files with the application an agreement, entered into with other licensees operating on the same frequency and in the same area to which the frequency is assigned, a statement giving their consent to the use of such increased power.

*DAYTIME

Daytime shall be that period between one hour after local sunrise and one hour before local sunset.
