I think that we should consider very seriously not only the office of the President but every other office below the President. In other words, get away from any tendency to make those positions only honorary. I think we as

individuals of this organization ought to ask ourselves what every candidate has to offer the organization or what right he has to be a candidate. Of course, if he is drafted, it is a ~~lot~~ different situation. It might not be out of line to ask him to come up to the mike and ask him to make a little campaign speech and so on. I would like to mention one or two of the requirements as I see it as head of the organization. In the first place, I am of the opinion that this organization is primarily a technical organization from the standpoint of police work. ^{Secondly,} It is a technical organization absolutely from the standpoint of radio. ^{Therefore,} so it is my opinion that we should elect a technical man. He must also have facilities, ^{available} for publishing bulletins. We had hoped that this publication might be handled by some other means, ^{in a joint Police Journal,} but I do not believe that will be possible at the present time. He must have secretarial help.
